- Math Students will continue studying multiplying fractions with an assessment mid-week..
- Science Students will continue studying ecosystems by researching various biomes and observing the growth of pants in a terrarium.
- Reading We will continue to focus on5.RL.2.2- Determine the theme of a story, play, or poem from details in the text. Identify how characters in a story or drama respond to challenges 5.RL.3.2- Describe how a narrator's point of view influences how events are portrayed. This week students will be introduced to some important poetry pieces. We will be analyzing their structures, themes, and author's point of view. They will be reading "The Fog," and "The Echoing Green." We will also continue to use the "Poety Code" to determine the structure, figurative language, and imagery used in a variety of poems.
